Revelstoke's Queen Victoria Cottage Hospital opened in August of 1902.




In 1910, a brick annex was added to the cottage hospital.




On August 21, 1912 the cornerstone was laid for the new brick Queen Victoria Hospital. MLA Thomas Taylor is facing the camera.


