MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

It was a successful year for the Foundation as we enjoyed growth in the value of the endowment and as a result had a record year for disbursements. The market value of the endowment administered by our Foundation is \$1,902,259. The majority of the growth was through the markets and \$52,914 was raised through local donations to the endowment. We are getting close to the two million dollar milestone and will likely be able to surpass that mark next year. We will continue our efforts to build the endowment for benefit of people living in Revelstoke.

This past year we were able to provide a record amount of funds to students and volunteer groups through our grant and scholarship programs. The Foundation granted \$44,181 to a wide variety of volunteer groups and awarded \$19,075 in scholarships to students to assist with post-secondary educational costs. The grants and scholarships are the lifeblood of the Foundation and the main reason for our existence and as such are always the highlight of the year. Three new scholarships were started. It is our hope to continue with the upward trend in the amounts of disbursements from the endowment.

The Foundation continued its efforts to engage youth in philanthropy. The Early Childhood Development Committee was supported through administration of the Success by Six and Children First funding. In addition we continue to administer the Glacier Adventure Stewardship Program Fund and the Emergency Shelter Fund.

In the fall a local anonymous donor stepped forward and provided \$6,000 to be disbursed to six groups in need of additional funding. The Foundation combined the presentation of the awards with a “Roaring Twenties” themed diner and celebration. The event was fun for all and profitable for a number of local organizations. We thank the donor for their generosity.

The Foundation exists because of the generosity of donors and volunteers. I would like to recognize and thank our Board of Directors for the time and energy they so freely provide the Foundation. Debby Robinson, David Rooney and Bob Fournier completed their terms as directors with the Foundation and we greatly appreciated their input and support over the years they were involved with the Foundation. A special thanks to Debra Wozniak for her care, concern and administrative support and Geoff Battersby for his continued support. The Revelstoke Credit Union, BDO and Community Futures Revelstoke contributed to our administrative expenses, and for that we are truly thankful. Finally, a sincere thank you to the people who support the Foundation through their generous donations.

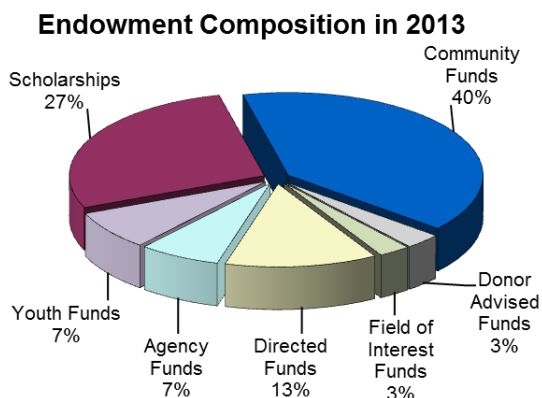

BUILDING OUR ENDOWMENT

Contributions to the Foundation in 2013 amounted to \$52,914 bringing the total value of the endowment to \$1,557,841.

In 2013, friends and family members donated in memory and added 15 new names to the ever growing list of In Memoriam Donations. Collective contributions in memory of three of these names have become 'endowed funds', that will soon give back by way of a bursary or scholarship to a deserving RSS student looking to advance his or her secondary schooling. As in the past, this method of donation goes towards preserving the names and memories of loved ones, and is also an excellent way to establish a fund which will give back to the community in perpetuity.

The Environmental Fund continues to build and is enjoying corporate support, particularly from the local branch of the Toronto Dominion Bank. The fund has reached a level of \$28,542 at December 31, 2013 and has already started giving back to the community. We will be working closely with local organizations in the coming months with respect to how best to distribute future investment income generated from this fund. The other exciting news comes to us from the Hillcrest Campbell Family Award Fund which is discussed on page 6.



The endowment funds consist of several different types of funds structured to meet the wishes of the donor. Community Funds are donated with the intent that the distributions are decided by a grants committee in response to an annual intake of grant applications. Scholarship Funds are awarded annually to local students pursuing post-secondary education. The remainder of the endowment portfolio (33%) is made up of Designated Funds that are established by donors with a specific charity or charitable activity 'designated' to receive the annual distributions.

The Fund Development Committee is continuing its drive to work towards the \$2 million mark. The Committee is continually impressed by the level of individual, family and corporate support for the Revelstoke Community Foundation. We are actively working towards 'planned giving' with a number of potential donors, a concept that is not new; it considers a donor's philanthropic goals and plans over time, resulting in regular donations to the Foundation.

GRANT STORIES

Summer Day Camp

All children and youth of Revelstoke can benefit from this fabulous opportunity for social connections: making new friends, developing social/leisure/recreational interests and skills, and participating in activities and trips they may not otherwise have an opportunity to enjoy. Each of the eight weeks of the program has a different theme. Each camper has the opportunity to participate regardless of their strengths, challenges or family situation. Each camper benefits from staff support to develop strong social skills and those with special needs are provided with the additional support they require to fully participate.



Food Bank & Nutrition Education

The Revelstoke Food Bank assists children, families, seniors and individuals who require food and services due to low income issues.

Funding helped provide a wide variety of nutrition education and resources to clients on a regular basis. The clients gained confidence in cooking and acquired the food knowledge necessary to make healthy food choices within a limited budget.

Maintaining off site food storage and transporting of food is a large undertaking. During 2013 funding helped transport and store more than 35,000 lbs of food: 10,000 lbs acquired through the National Food Sharing System and 12,000 lbs from the annual Emergency Services Food Drive as well as other ongoing donations from the local community. These food products provide nourishing hampers throughout the year to low income residents.

Veterinary Care

General care, food and veterinary care were provided for the animals in the shelter while awaiting adoptions.

Spay/neutering was also provided to increase their adoptability and reduce overpopulation from unwanted pregnancies. Eighteen animals were spayed or neutered, twenty five cats or kittens and three dogs were adopted during 2013.



Screen Smart Lego Creation Event

The event was held at the Railway Museum to encourage children to turn off their screens and spend time with their families while using their imaginations building with Lego. 105 people participated in the event with 38 Lego creations displayed from 60 children aged preschool to 12 years old.



Everyone had the opportunity to learn more about the history of the Lego company and participate in various hands-on activities with a Lego and/or train related theme. Some feedback from Screen Smart participants:

- *All the children's displays were so creative – there was even a Lego flashlight that worked!*
- *The Lego Train was so cool.*
- *The Lego comic will be a good bedtime story*



Reduction of Fruit as a Bear Attractant

Habituated and food conditioned bears are the most likely to become aggressive and to be destroyed. Reducing these behavioural attributes was the goal achieved in 2013. Fifteen properties were gleaned, five properties were adopted and many wild or unmanaged trees

were mapped and either removed or harvested.

Excess fruit harvested was donated to the Food Bank, or used for a juicing demonstration and a preschool applesauce project.



Building Blocks Project



The Revelstoke Youth Liaison promoted the idea of Youth Philanthropy and consulted with youth through a wide variety of engagement opportunities. Stoke Youth network promotion 'swag' was purchased and a weekly youth drop in night a local café was established to promote youth engagement and participation. This project helped to increase awareness amongst the youth community of opportunities available to them.

LIVING & GIVING BACK IN REVELSTOKE

Environmental Fund Growing



The environmental fund now sits at \$28,542 thanks to the continued support of the TD Bank and local citizens. The fund will receive another \$5,000 boost this year from the TD Bank to help attain our goal of reaching the \$50,000 endowment.

W Earl Campbell Challenge

In 2002, Earl issued an interesting challenge focused on improving the Revelstoke Secondary School scholarship situation. His initial \$2,500 challenge had attracted an additional \$5,783 by the end of the year, a remarkable achievement in such a short amount of time. Today, the Hillcrest Campbell Award Fund has swelled to almost \$50,000 and provides two \$1,000 scholarships every year to worthy students in need seeking higher education.

Earl's grandfather, Daniel Campbell acquired the original Campbell farm property in 1907. Over time the Campbell Family purchased additional adjacent properties to eventually have 605 acres. The farm land has been managed for the provision of good deer and caribou habitat, and enhanced silviculture activities supported by selection logging. The original farm included what are now the KOA property, the Johnson Heights subdivision and the Hillcrest Hotel sites. Most of the remaining farm property on Mt Revelstoke has recently been sold.

In a recent conversation with Earl, he said that he is happy with the milestone, and there are numerous friends and local Revelstokians who have helped make it work. He acknowledges that education and related training programs are getting more expensive every year. He believes that this milestone should be the beginning of the work towards 'fattening' the Hillcrest Campbell Award, as soon as possible, to provide at least twice the size of the present award amounts.

Earl was asked why he is doing this. He said, 'It is pretty simple. I would never have been able to complete a university degree over 5 years without some financial support. I established a bursary to assist students going to UBC from outside Vancouver. In over 15 years, no Revelstokian ever received that award. My wife at the time had worked for Student Services at UBC, so we knew how awards worked. We decided that we needed to assist not only RSS academic winners, but those who needed financial assistance as well.'

The Campbell Family will match the donations of others up to \$12,500 per year.

Southside Community Rewards
