French Immersion Quick Facts:

- The French Immersion curriculum is exactly the same as the English curriculum. The only difference between the two programs is the language of instruction.
- Parents of children in French Immersion are not expected to understand or speak any French.
- Research has shown that French second-language education does not diminish math or English-language skills. In fact, studies suggest learning a second language can enhance cognitive and intellectual abilities.
- Currently, over 275,000 B.C. students are enrolled in French Immersion and this school year marks the 13th straight increase in French Immersion enrollment across the province.

What is French Immersion?

French Immersion is a Canadian educational program in which children study in French even though their first language is not French. Research shows that this is the most effective way for a child to become bilingual. It is offered through the public school system but only when parents express enough interest. In BC, Early Immersion starts in Kindergarten or Grade 1. In French Immersion all activities and learning during elementary grades are in French, except for English arts. Students who complete the program graduate with two secondary school diplomas.

Is French Immersion related to the new Francophone School?

No, French Immersion in Revelstoke should not be confused with the new “École des Glaciers” which is the Francophone school located at Arrow Heights Elementary. École des Glaciers is a separate school operated by a different school board called the Conseil Scolaire Francophone and available only to children with at least one Francophone parent.

Why should I choose French Immersion for my child?

Graduates of a full Immersion Program can expect increased appreciation of other languages and cultures, enhanced career potential, a greater facility for learning other languages as well as a more global view of Canada and the world.
