



School Completion & Academic Achievement

2012 – 2013 Objectives:

- Reduce the number of students with multiple course failures by addressing assignment completion.
- Review consistent and predictable grading / assessment expectations for students in all subjects.
- Reduce the number of students in grade 8 through 10 achieving at a C- or below level and increase the number of students achieving a C+ or better.

Targets for 2012/2013

- *Expected results:*
- Reduce the number of students achieving “N” for work ethic to below 10%
- Sustain school completion (Dogwood) rates at or above 90%.
- Reduce the number of students achieving in the “pass” rate (50-67%) to below 15%



Literacy

2012 – 2013 Objectives:

- To achieve 90% of students meeting grade level expectations in writing
- To achieve 90% of students meeting grade level expectations in reading fluency

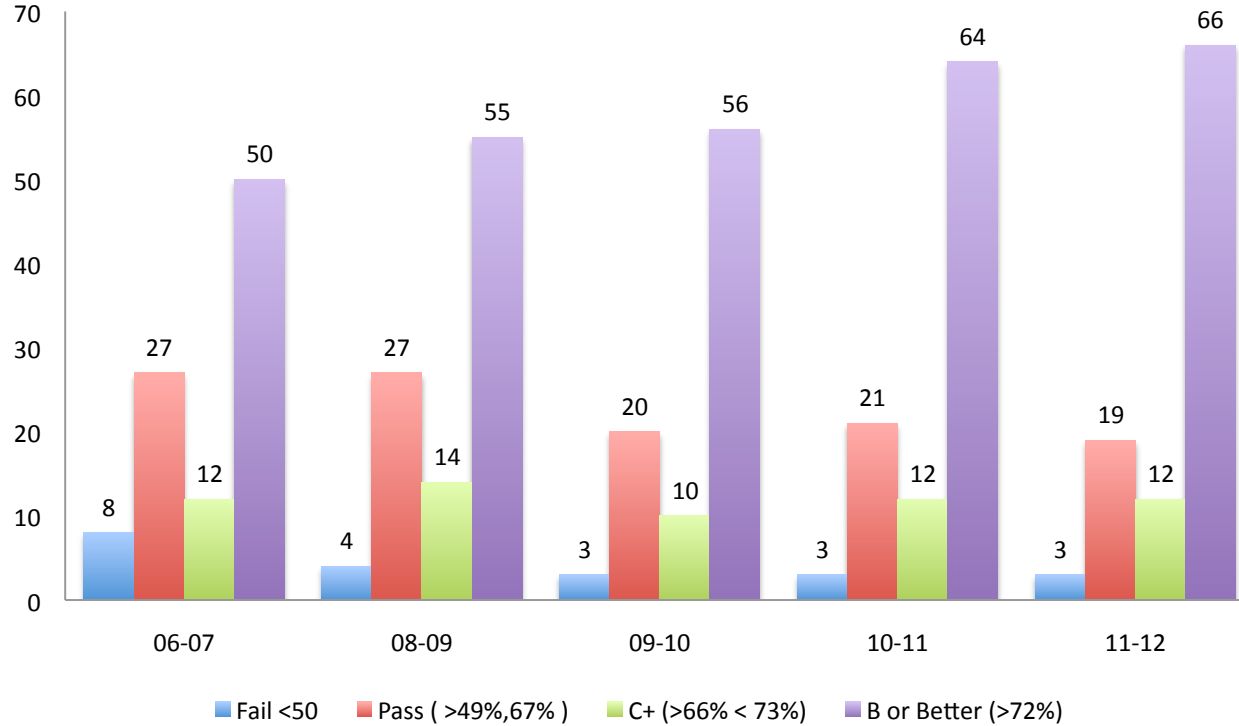
Targets for 2012/2013

- *Expected results:*
- Reduce the number of grade 8/9 students reading below reading levels by 5%
- 70% of students taking Communications 12 receiving 67% or better of the provincial exam
- 80% of students receiving 67% or better on the English 10 and 12 Provincial Exams
- 80% of at-risk students who take GORT test improve scores from Fall to Spring

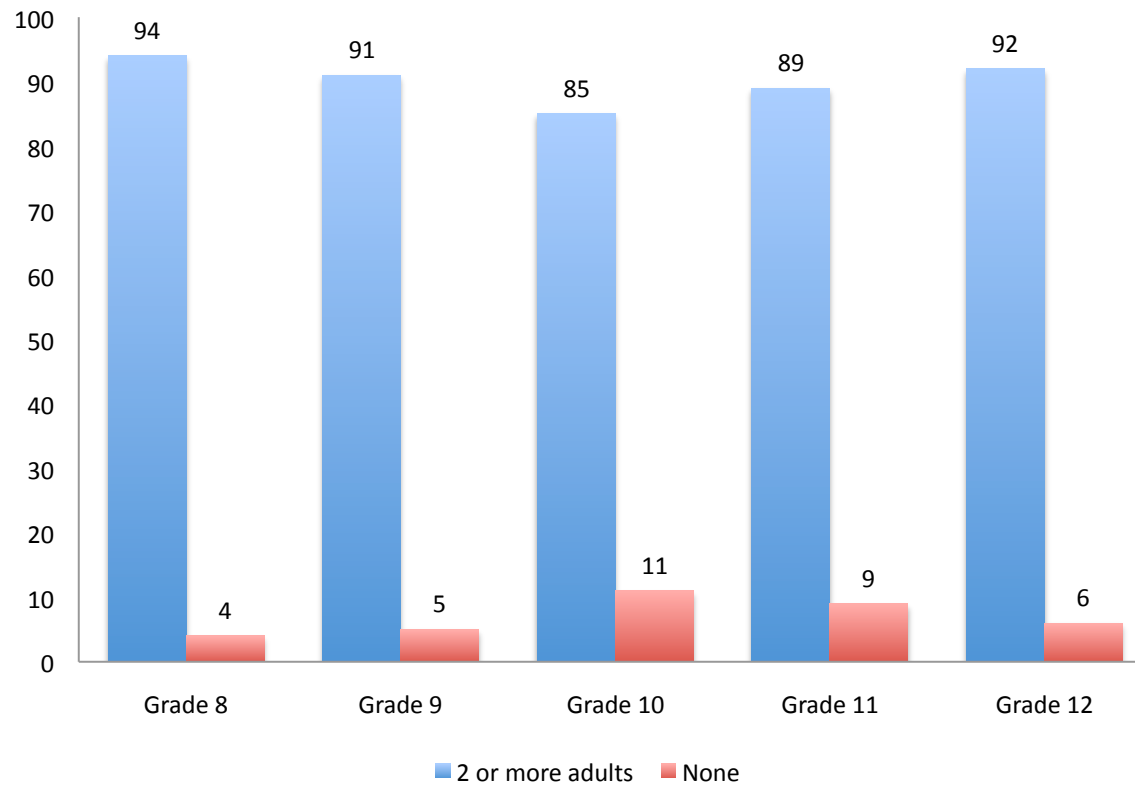
Achievement Grades: All Courses

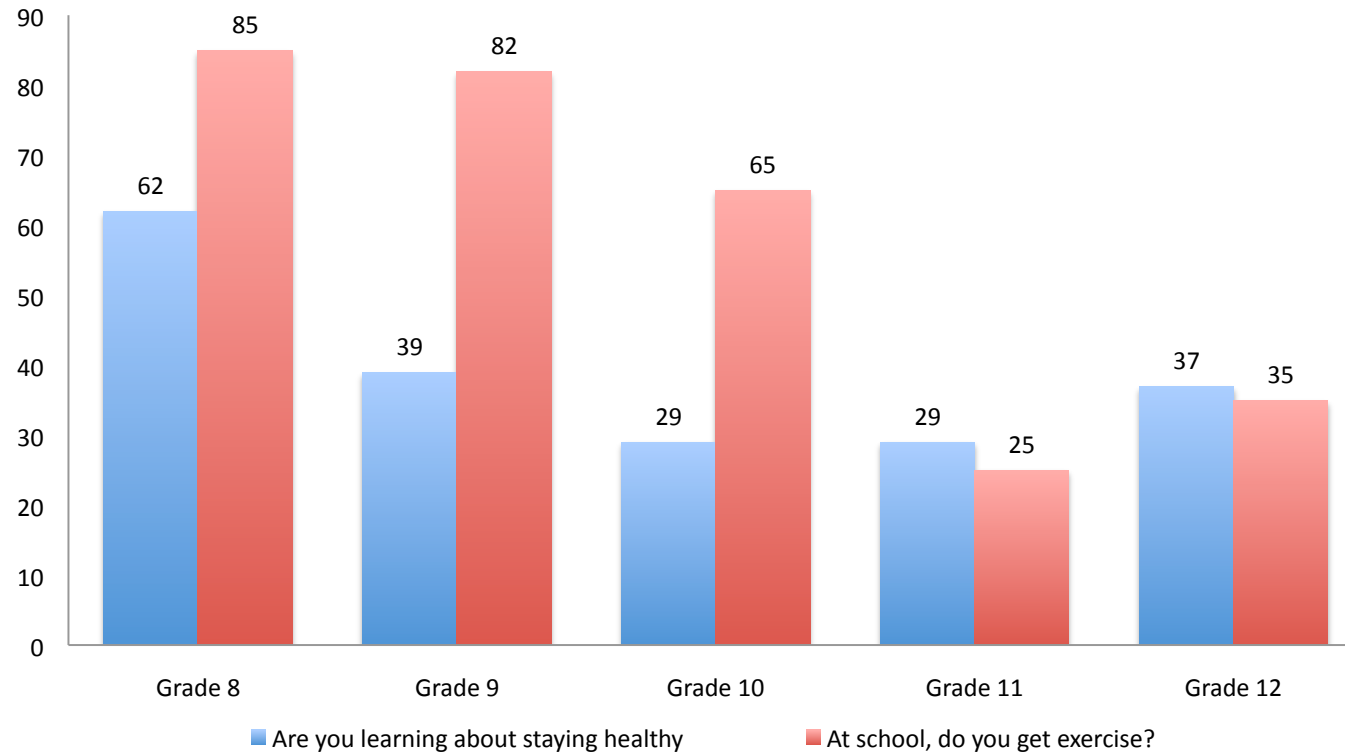
How many adults at your school care about you?





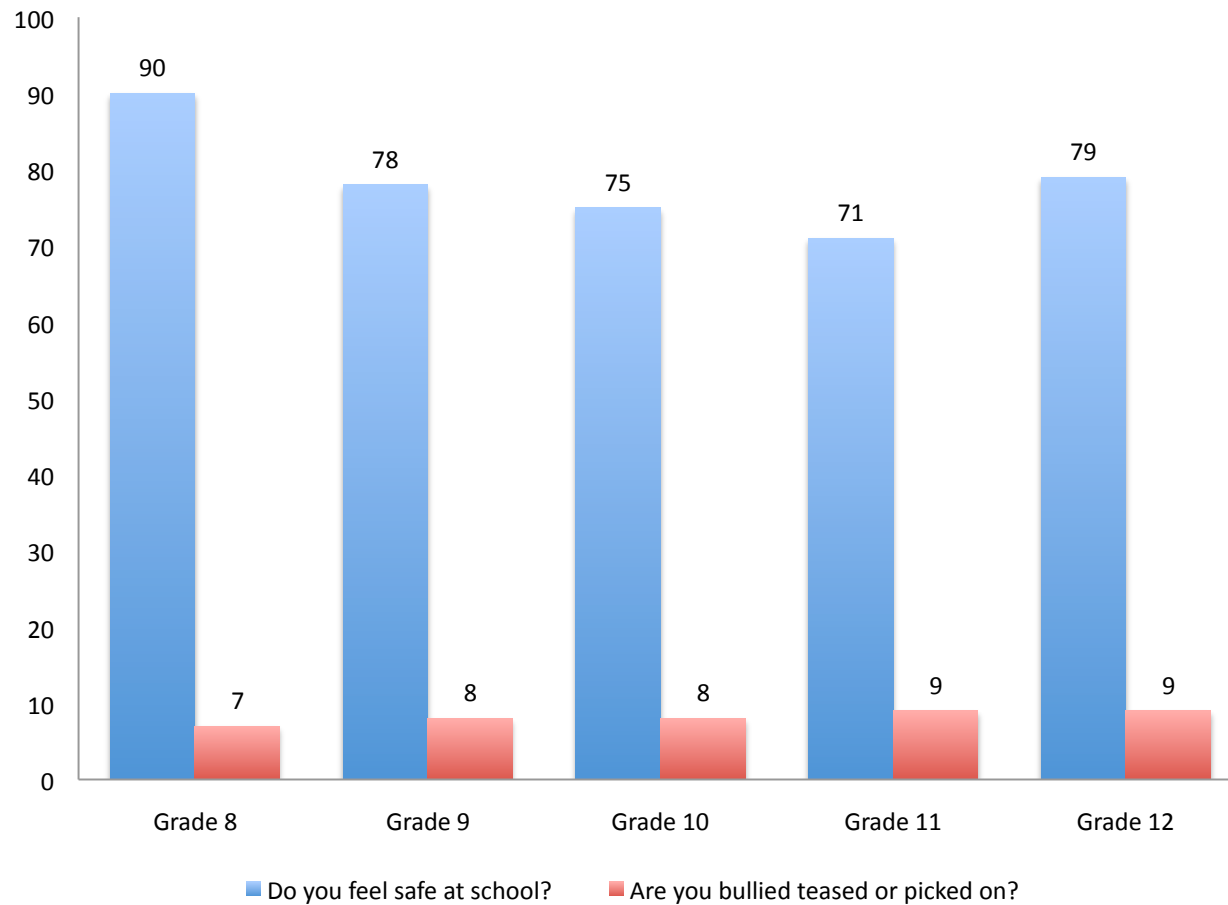
Healthy Living 2013
