Dr. Brokenleg is an internationally renowned Lakota Sioux family-care expert, and co-author of the book *Reclaiming Youth at Risk: our hope for the future* and co-developer of the circle of courage model.

Dr. Brokenleg holds a doctorate in psychology. He is a retired professor and was most recently Director of Native Ministries and Professor of First Nations Theology at the Vancouver School of Theology. For thirty years, Dr. Brokenleg was Professor of Native American studies at Augustana University of Sioux Falls, South Dakota. He has also been a director of The Neighborhood Youth Corps, chaplain in a correctional setting, and has extensive experience as an alcohol counselor.
